1. What is the central declaration of Deuteronomy 6:4, known in Judaism as the Shema?

2. What does Deuteronomy 6:5 command regarding how we love God?

3. According to Deuteronomy 6:6-7, how should God's commands be passed on?

4. What physical reminders are described in Deuteronomy 6:8-9?

5. Reflection: Jesus later quotes verse 5 as the greatest commandment. How might you weave love for God into your 'ordinary life' the way verse 7 describes?

Deuteronomy 6:4-9

⁴Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD: ⁵And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. ⁶And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: ⁷And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. ⁸And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes. ⁹And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates.
